Saturday morning, England.

Patiently waiting for more copies of the Recorder to follow, I was disappointed. Did you send them? I hope you put me on the mailing list. I really enjoyed the one issue I received 2 months ago.

I have been very busy but ~~can~~ earned one or two days off occasionally. I have been sight-seeing. I was to Cheddar Gorge where there are some wonderful caves with stalagmites, etc and where cheese used to come from. The war has put a stop to famous Cheddar cheese being available at all. I visited Wells, a city known for its very old cathedral (about 1400) which is still intact & services still being held there. I was to Bath, a city which got its name from the fact that it has hot underground springs and was the site of Roman baths (partly on display, fully recovered) back 1700 years ago when the Romans occupied Britain. A typical summer resort, almost a smaller counterpart of Atlantic City, is Weston-Super-Mare. All these places are of great interest and worth seeing, in my estimation. Aside from these, the country is in itself very nice and the people are very friendly and helpful.
