

Life Insurance As An Estate Planning Tool

Most well-to-do people need life insurance as part of the solution to the problem of federal estate taxa-

The federal estate tax is applied on virtually all assets in which the decedent had an interest, and frequently a person's assets consist of illiquid assets such as businesses or real estate. Inflation must also be considered; for example: if your

Another valuable estate planning tool is the Charitable Remainder Trust (CRT) combined with a Wealth Replacement Trust (WRT). In this arrangement, highly appreciated assets are transferred to the CRT and the trustee may sell the assets without capital gains tax, and purchase other assets which may provide diversi-

assets generated an annual 7% rate of return, your estate would double every 10 years under Rule of 72 (assuming no depletion of the assets).

If an individual owns a policy of insurance on his life, it is included as part of is estate for federal tax purposes. To avoid this, the existing insurance policy could be transferred to an Irrevocable Life Insurance Trust (ILIT). However, policies transferred to an ILIT are not excluded from the grantor's (individual's) estate until three years from the date of transfer. To avoid this three year rule, new insurance should be purchased by the trust. Therefore, the trustee should be the applicant, owner and beneficiary of the new policy.

The main advantage of a life insurance policy owned by a properly drafted ILIT are 1) the policy proceeds are nor included in the estate of the insured; 2) annual

exclusion gifts may be utilized; 3) joint mortality tables are used. cash value builds without income taxation; 4) the policy avoids probate and offers privacy; 5) the proceeds provide estate liquidity; and 6) the grantor predetermines the ultimate disposition of assets when the trust is drafted, much like a will. Second-to-die life insurance, owned by ILIT, is one of the most popular estate planning tools for married couples. Generally, the policy premium is less expensive for insuring two lives than buying two separate policies on each individual. Additionally, with a properly drafted and funded ILIT, proceeds should not be included in the estate of either spouse, but the proceeds may be available to provide estate liquidity at the second spouse's death, when estate taxes are generally due.

Survivorship insurance may be purchased even if one of the spouses is in poor health, since

Another valuable estate planning tool is the Charitable Remainder Trust (CRT) combined with a Wealth Replacement Trust (WRT). In this arrangement, highly appreciated assets are transferred to the CRT and the trustee may sell the assets without capital gains tax, and purchase other assets which provide diversification. Additionally, the donor receives an income tax deduction, based upon the value of the interest passing to the charity. The CRT pays income to one or both spouses, and upon their deaths the remainder then goes to a favorite charity. To replace the assets which are going to the charity, a WRT is often used. A WRT funded with a survivorship life insurance policy may replace children's inheritance. Generally, the only party not benefiting from the use of a CRT and WRT is the IRS.

On Aharon Appelfield

summer, Aharon Appelfeld's new book, "The Ice Mine," was published. Appelfeld is considered one of the most important writers of our time. His books have been translated into many languages, among them, Chinese and Japanese; in 1983 he received the Israel Prize, and recently was accepted as a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences.

Aharon Appelfeld was born in 1932 in Chemovita, which is in

He was 8 years old when his mother was murdered by gunshots near their house. He and his father were taken to the Transnysteria camp, when Aharon was 10, they took his father from the camp, and the boy was left alone in the world. The chance that he would survive was small, but he remained alive. Appelfeld is sure that he survived because of people who spoke with him, hugged him, or gave him a quarter of a slice of salami. "The love rescued me," he says.

In 1946, when he was 14, Aharon Appelfeld "went up to the

land" with Youth Aliyah. He never stopped hoping that he would meet his father, and used to look for his father's name in the lists of survivors; he also listened to the radio to the "Section for Seeking Relatives." In 1953, he saw his father's name in one of the lists; his father had arrived in "the land" a short time ago. They took Aharon to an orchard, and showed him an old man, who worked picking oranges. It was 11 years after the Nazis separated them. The father recognized him and ran to him. He never thought to search for his son, because he never imagined 'hat a

boy of 10, remaining alone in the world, could survive.

Ten years ago, Appelfeld began to write "The Ice Mine," and in the dedication wrote: "A candle to remember my father, Michael Appelfeld, who built the bridge on the river Boog." The book tells about the group of Jews, in the time of the Shoah, whose job was to carry large, heavy wooden girders which were used in the building of the bridge on the river. The father of the writer was one of those Jews. He was taken to the work of building the bridge after they tore him from his son.

Appelfeld wrote many books and stories on topics connected to the Shoah, but "The Ice Mine" is the first book in which he described life in the camp - the lineups, the brutality, and the hard labor. The author shows how, in the midst of hell, there was also love, compassion, generosity, and help for one's

In the first chapter of the book the emphasis is on the humanity and the generosity of the prisoners against a background of the cruel treatment by the Nazis.

Saved From The Holocaust - Jewish Music

German border guards destroyed some of the recordings, time took its toll on others, and some were lost during the Holocaust. But thanks to the work of rabbis and musicologists from throughout the world, the beautiful sacred music recorded before the Holocaust by the Berlin Reform Congregation in Germany has been preserved and is available on compact disc.

The Musical Tradition of the Jewish Reform Congregation in Berlin, Berlin, released by Beth Hatefutsoth (the Museum of the by Beth Jewish Diaspora in Tel Aviv), is now available in North America through a special agreement with Transcontinental Music Publica-

"We're pleased we have the opportunity to distribute this compilation because it's an important historic document for all the Jewish people and particularly the Reform movement," said Dr. Judith B. Tischler, director of Transcontinental Music Publications.

This music, played by the créme of Berlin musicians of the 1920s, is a tribute to the many faceted creativity of German Jewry during the Weimar Republic.

"There is a tragic yet majestic quality to the music," commented Rabbi John Levi of Melbourne, Australia, who brought the tapes to the attention of Beth Hatefutsoth's Feher Jewish Music Center four years ago. "It is the heritage of a highly cultured and assimilated Jewish community that was unaware its world was about to be destroyed.

Recorded between 1920 and 1930 and featuring soloists and a hundred-voice choir, the project was initiated by Hermann Schildberger, the Berlin synagogue's musical director and conductor. He thought that giving small, new Reform congregations, old age homes, and hospitals access to the liturgy and beautiful performances would be wonderful. Many of the original recordings

were lost when Schildberger and his wife had to flee from Germany in 1939, but a few made it safely with them when they immigrated to Australia. The recordings eventually came into the possession of Rabbi Levi.

"This music can be regarded as one of the last musical achievements of a free German Jewish community," said Rabbi Levi.

Hijacker To Tel-Aviv

A Spanish hijacker who had demanded to be flown to Israel gave up peacefully after a four-hour hostage standoff. It was unknown why the hijacker, who held more than 100 passengers hostage and who reportedly had a history of mental illness, wanted to go to Tel Aviv.

The Swiss government refused to give compensation to a

Holocaust survivor who says he was handed over to the Nazis by Switzerland in 1943. Joseph Spring claims that he and two cousins were turned over when they tried to sneak across the border from France into Switzerland. Spring, who ended up in Auschwitz, says he will take his case to the Swiss Supreme Court. Campaign Against Pullback

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin

Netanyahu rejected criticism of a possible non-binding referendum on a further redeployment from the West Bank. Netanyahu's remarks came a day after Israel's justice minister said he would recommend that such a referendum be held on the matter of light of the difficulties in arranging a binding referendum. Meanwhile, Jewish settlers set up a tent opposite the Prime Minister's Office in the first step of a public campaign against the pullback.

June 30 Deadline fo Holocaust Claims

Jewish and Swiss representatives met at the State Department to discuss the status of the negotiations on a settlement to Holocaust-era claims. Both sides have accused each other of jeopardizing the negotiating process by violating confidentiality agreements. The banks last week said their best offer for settling claims was \$800 million, an amount rejected by Jewish negotiators. The talks are running

up against a June 30 deadline a date set by U.S. public finance officers to review the negotiations and possibly impose sanctions on the Swiss.

Deportation Of Former SS Officer

The U.S. Justice Department said it would deport an 80-year-old man who was a member of a Lithuanian mobile-killing squad during World War II. The department's Office of Special



Investigations said Kazyz Ciurinskas lied about his past when he emigrated to the United States in 1949. Ciurinskas, who now lives in Hammond, Ind., became a citizen in 1955.

Return of Hamas Spiritual Leader Questioned

Israeli Defense Minister Yitzhak Mordechai said Israel had not decided whether to allow Hamas spiritual leader Sheik Ahmed Yassin to return to the Gaza Strip, according to Israel Radio. This news follows reports that Israel had decided to readmit Yassin, whom Israel released from prison last September. Meanwhile, Yassin was admitted to an Egyptian military hospital for treatment. He recently concluded a tour of the Middle East on which he is believed to have

raised millions of dollars for Hamas.

Israeli police launched a criminal investigation into remarks by an Arab Knesset member that he was surprised the Palestinians don't kill more land dealers who sell property to Jews. Haddash Knesset member Salakh Salim's remarks were made during a tour of Jerusalem's Old City by members of the parliamentary interior committee. The National Religious Party demanded that Salim's parliamentary immunity be removed, and accused him of inciting violence.

New Security Measures

Israeli Public Security Minister Avigdor Kahalani approved the installation of closed-circuit television in Jerusalem's Old City as a security measure. The decision to install the system was taken following the murder of yeshiva student Gabriel Hirschberg earlier this year. Mothers Beaten By Palestian

A Palestinian human rights group said Palestinian police beat the mothers of Palestinian prisoners held by Israel. A senior Palestinian official denied the report by the Palestinian Center for Human Rights, which said the mothers were beaten when they

went to the Finance Ministry to ask for financial support.

The Arab League called an emergency meeting for Thursday to discuss Israel's plans to expand the borders of Jerusalem. A spokesman for the 22-member group was quoted as saying that the meeting "will be an attempt to stop Israel from taking the region to the edge of the abyss." Meanwhile, Iran asked the Organization of the Islamic Conference to meet to discuss the Israeli plan.

Syrian and Lebanese officials walked out of a meeting of an international customs organization because of Israeli participation. The walkout comes after Lebanon's prime minister said an agreement on an Israeli withdrawal from Lebanon could be reached in three months if Israel agreed to pick up talks where they left off in 1996.

Sen. Alfonse D'Amato (R-N.Y.) denounced a \$600 million offer by Swiss banks to settle Holocaust-era claims. D'Amato said the Senate Banking Committee which he chairs plans to reopen a 50-year-old accord signed with Switzerland on the return of Nazi-looted gold. In the 1946 Washington accord Switzerland agreed to return \$58 million to the Allies despite records which showed Switzerland accepted about five times that amount in looted gold.

U.S. Not Happy With Israel
Plan For Expansion

The U.S. State Department continued to criticize Israel for plans to expand the borders of Jerusalem. "The last thing we need from either party are statements or actions that raise suspicions and make it even more difficult to get the process back on track," State Department spokesman James Rubin said. But Rubin toned down his comments after Netanyahu clarified the plans in three separate phone calls with U.S. Secretary of State Madeleine Albright.

Appointment Of Special Advisor

Lithuania's president appointed a former professor of political science at Indiana University to fill the post of special adviser on Lithuanian-Jewish relations. The adviser, Julius Smulkstys, said, "Full investigations on what was happening in Lithuania during Nazi occupation should be launched." The leader of the Jewish community in Lithuania called the appointment a "positive" step.

Trial Postponed

The trial in Lithuania of an alleged Nazi war criminal has been postponed for the third time. The trial of Aleksandras Liteikis, 91, was slated to begin in late June or early July. It was unknown when the trial would begin.

Proposal on Pluralism

An Israeli Knesset committee was scheduled to discuss a proposal to codify the recommendations of a committee to deal with the crisis over religious pluralism. The bill dealing with the Ne'eman Committee's recommendations proposes the establishment of a pluralistic conversion training institute, run under the auspices of the Jewish Agency for Israel, while also reaffirming the Orthodox establishment's sole authority to confirm conversions in Israel. Finance

Minister Ya'acov Ne'eman, representatives from the Chief Rabbinate, and the Reform and Conservative movements are invited to appear before the committee.

Israel Stock Offer

Bank Hapoalim plans to issue what is expected to be the largest stock offering of an Israeli company on Wall Street, according to Israeli media reports. The offering is expected to reach hundreds of millions of dollars, exceeding an offering Friday of the telecommunications firm Amdocs, which totaled \$250 million.

Appeal From Rabins Assassin

Israel's Supreme Court heard an appeal from Yitzhak Rabin's assassin. Yigal Amir, his brother Hagai and his friend Dror Adani, appealed their sentences for conspiring to assassinate Rabin and attack Arabs. The attorney for Yigal Amir, who is serving a life sentence for shooting Rabin at a Tel Aviv peace rally in November 1995, said contacts were currently underway with prison authorities to see if the two brothers could serve out their sentences in the same cell. Prison officials denied that such a move was being considered. Czech Republic Party

The far-right Republican Party failed to reach the 5 percent threshold necessary for representation in the Czech Republic's Parliament. The party, which is anti-Semitic, anti-Gypsy and opposes the Czech Republic's joining NATO, polled only 3.9 percent, down from 8 percent in the 1996 elections. The left-of-center Social Democrats won the largest number of seats and are expected to form a coalition with the centrist Christian Democrats, who are strong supporters of restitution of Jewish property.

Italian Rabbi Disturbed By
Question "Who Is A Jew?"

The president of the Assembly of Italian Rabbis said he is disturbed over Italian divisions about "Who is a Jew?" Giuseppe Laras made his comments at a quadrennial meeting of the Union of Italian Jewish Communities, an umbrella organization that represents Italy's 35,000 Jews. The three-day congress which opened Sunday, is held every four years. At the congress, Tullia Zevi is expected to step down as head of the organization after 15 years as president.

South Africa Is Said To Be Free From Anti-Semitism

Israel's ambassador to southern Africa said anti-Semitism is "essentially absent" from the region. Gershon Gan made his comments at the biennial meeting of the African Jewish Congress held in Windhoek, the capital of Namibia. Namibia, one of the countries in the region, was once known as a haven for ex-Nazis.

Clinton Leadership Needed in Serbian Problem

Nine Jewish organizations said in a joint statement that President Clinton should provide leadership to prevent ethnic cleansing in the Serbian province of Kosovo. The letter, whose signatories included all four streams of Judaism, applauded the recent U.N. call for air strikes against Serbia. it also said: "We failed to act quickly and forcefully in Rawanda and Bosnia. We must not allow Kosovo to become another Bosnia."







Celebrating Delaware's Connection_

To The Holyand

By TONI YOUNG

During World War II, Jacob Kraft, who had become rabbi of Congregation Beth Shalom in 1930, volunteered as a chaplain in the United States Armed Forces. He served with distinction until 1946 when he returned to Beth Shalom. While he was attached to the 15th Air Force division in Southern Italy in 1945, Rabbi Kraft learned that he and a group of chaplains would be sent to Palestine and Egypt for a week. "As for my trip to HaAretz, it is something that I hadn't ever dreamed of a week ago, it came as the proverbial manna from heaven," he wrote to his dear wife Leah on June 4. The following excerpts from his letters to Leah and his 1970s article, "A Chaplain Visits Palestine," describe a few highlights of his Shabbat in Palestine.

"The flight to Tel Litvinsky, later known as the Lod airport, was to me one of indefinable expectancy. Every Jew is thrilled by a trip to this land, yet for me there was a greater thrill. I was brought up in a home where Zionism and particularly Mizrachi, were the holy expressions of a bi-millennial yearning... My parents of blessed memory, accepted the doctrine that 'religious faith without the national spirit was only half Judaism and that the Hebrew language must be the language of daily life as well as of worship and study."

"I came to Jerusalem just in time to change clothes for the purpose of attending Sabbath Eve services at the Bet HaKnesset Jeshurun. It pious Jews, with Streimeles, large, round fur hats, long black silk kapotes and peot watching the shops to ensure their being closed in time. The Jeshurun Synagogue building is a simple but beautiful structure. It is a large one story building, built on a rotunda style with entrance on the side. The auditorium has a light brown marble floor and walls, it gives the appearance of hospital like cleanliness. The service of course was traditional and like that of any service in an orthodox synagogue in the States. The cantor had a splendid, melodious voice. The synagogue was almost full; it was a treat to see youngsters of ten and eleven recite the prayers by heart. When the cantor recited the last verse of the "L Cho Dodee" and faced the rear of the synagogue, it seemed as if the newly arrived Sabbath had actually swept through the building, for as we faced the exit, we saw that a long row of folding doors had been moved aside, exposing to our view the courtyard, which was surrounded by trees and flowers. Thus the early evening Jerusalem air and Nature's fragrance greeted us as messengers of the Sabbath's arrival. The service in this setting was a fitting climax to an inspira-

tional first day in the Holy Land."

was very interesting to see the very pious Jews, with Streimeles, large, round fur hats, long black silk kapotes and peot watching the shops to ensure their being closed in time. The Jeshurun Synagogue building is a simple but beautiful school... I enjoyed listening to the methodical and musical rendition of the Torah, and watching the youngsters following the Parasha attentively. There was no need to ask whether they understood the text."

'The highlight of the afternoon's visit to the old city was the view at the Wailing Wall. The general scent and surroundings had been sufficiently described to me by eyewitnesses that I knew what to expect. I had been told that the approaches to it were through narrow lanes, that Arabs frequently thronged the outer precincts of the wall, and that the approaches were frequently dirty. I even came across a group of half naked Arab children around the corner of the Kotel, playing at a game that looked very similar to dice ... It is true that on the one side of the wall, hemming it at right angles is the Mosque and at the left hand side is the abode of the infamous Mufti of Jerusalem. Yet somehow, there was a Sabbatical atmosphere about the wall, and there was neatness and brightness there; for the ancient alleyway or street in front of the wall, was clean and the sun's rays spread its brilliance as well as its heat at the Wall. The stones that constitute the remnant of the ancient Temple are rather huge; a green moss or grass grows between the crevices, the imprint of many centuries upon it for thousands are the lips that kissed the stone, and as many hands fondled its rough contours. I saw little notes inserted in the crevices, likewise a few markings chiseled or engraved on the sur-

face. It was early afternoon, about 3 p.m. and the pious were just beginning to assemble for recitation of Psalms and the Mincha services. There were venerable looking Jews in long black silk kapotes and fur streimeles, each one graced with a beard of generous proportions; there were youngsters, who unable to vie with their elders in the matter of a beard, sufficed with the next best thing, the displaying of earlocks of as generous and well curled proportions. There were old wizened gentlemen with the dark skin that betokened Yemen as the land of their origin; there were old ladies in wide skirts and broad shawls. Whether reciting Tehilim or praying, all of them swayed back and forth and would approach the Kotel and kiss the stone reverently, I recited my Sabbath Mincha prayers, stood right at the wall for the Shmonen Esreh and thereby attempted to link my worshipful self with the hoary past and the spiritually enduring character of our people. However, truth to tell, the surroundings themselves do not make for the sanctity and awe that one expects. It is only the dim historic memories or the "mystic" chord of memory that induce the spirit of reverence. Here there was sanctity only in memory: at the Jeshurun Synagogue, in Kfar Etzyon, Givat Brenner, and the Bilu or Balfour School, there was inspiration in a glorious reality, the creative power of the Yishuv, its united determination to build a national home. The wall should remain as a symbol of the guilt that a callous and cruel world imposes on the Jew; Hebrew University, Hadassah Hospital, the Sochnut (Jewish Agency) Building, the settlements, and the Jewish cities are a symbol

of the unconquerable will of the Jewish people to build out of desolate valleys and barren hills a great national homeland. What a contrast between the old city and the new!"

'I retraced my steps along Ben Yehudah street, but where early in the day the street had the deserted, Sabbatical appearance comparable to Sunday morning in Wilmington, now there was the full current of life. Ben Yehuda street was thronged, that beautiful park was alive with children and the open square where Jaffa Road and Ben Yehudah street meet, was throbbing with life. This section of Jerusalem was not a memorial to an ancient past, glorious as it might have been, here no sighs, no vain nostalgic yearnings, no tears, but here was a radiant testimonial to a vibrant living, determined people and the words of the prophet rang in my ears. As we looked down on the mass of people in the square from the balcony of the Tel Aviv Hotel, Grosevsky, my guide, said, "Remember well, Chaplain, the juncture of these streets, this scene of life and activity. This will be the starting point of the mighty protest that will well up from the Yishuv when Britain seeks to choke our progress and limit the growth of our community. Remember well, Jaffa Road and Ben Yehuda

Rabbi Kraft believed that "The whole Binyan HaAretz is the expression of the determined will of a people not to accept the degraded lot, the impoverished physical status that an indifferent world might desire to make inevitable. Palestine is the articulate yearning not only of our people, but of all people to rise above a poverty status, physical as well as economic, to say to the world, 'Not only is this status not inevitable, but it need not be."



BOOK REVIEW

Kidnapping Of Edgardo Mortara

If anyone had asked me before I had read "The Kidnapping of Edgardo Mortara" when the inquisition occurred, I would have answered the 15th or 16th centuries - around the time of Columbus' voyages to America. If asked where the inquisition took place, I would have said Spain. Well, although my answers would have been correct, they would not have been complete. It wasn't until I read "The Kidnapping of Edgardo Mortara" that I learned that the inquisition lasted until the unification of Italy (circa 1870) and was in full force in the Papal States in the mid-19th century.

"The Kidnapping of Edgardo Mortara" concerns the abduction of a six-year-old Jewish child in 1858 from his family in Bologna by the papal authorities because he had allegedly been secretly baptized by a Catholic servant. Sadly, this type of occurrence was all too common in the areas dominated by the Catholic Church well into the 19th century. What made this case unique was that the Mortaras enlisted the support of worldwide Jewry to fight for the return of their son, and the international outcry over the abduction led to the end of papal control over large portions of what is now Italy and ultimately to the unification of Italy.

David Kertzer, a professor of anthropology and history at

Brown, writes a heavily footnoted treatise on the Mortara affair. He is Jewish, but tries very hard to give a balanced interpretation of both the Mortaras' anguish and the Catholic Church's unbending belief in that it was saving a soul.

Born and raised in New York City, Professor Kertzer was attracted to the Mortara story because his American father was among those soldiers who liberated Italian Jewry as World War II was ending. His father also had the opportunity to participate in the first service in the synagogue in Rome celebrating the return of the Jewish remnant. Kertzer dedicates this book to his

Although the book goes into detail about the worldwide notoriety this case received, I had never heard of Edgardo Mortara. While I was reading Edgardo's story, I happened to receive email from a Jewish woman in Bologna, where the Mortaras had lived. When I asked her about Edgardo Mortara. she too had never heard of him. Since one result of the struggle between the Jewish community and the Catholic Church was the feeling among those following the story at the time that the Catholic religion "won," I guess it should be no surprise that the story of Edgardo Mortara was not passed down among the generations in the Bologna Jewish community.

It was painful to me, as a mother, to read about the futile attempts

of a disconsolate family to win back their young son. Every attempt they made to visit with him was either rebuffed by the Vatican or occurred under strict supervision. The child was raised in the papal quarters, subjected to Catholic teachings on such an intense and regular basis that it should come as no surprise that he became a priest,, believing that Judaism was an abomination and his family fatally flawed, and made his life's work the conversion of the Jews.

Kertzer makes no attempt to analyze the reasons for the boy's complete capitulation to Catholic doctrine in light of what we know today of the malleability of children and the captive's eventual reliance on the captor, no matter how overbearing and unyielding. Professor Kertzer was wise not to do so because he is not a psychologist

and any "pop psychology" would have compromised his neutral, almost passionless rendition of the Mortara story. The facts of the story are intense enough in and of themselves to elicit powerful emotions from the reader.

Kertzer ends the book by stating that Edgardo died at the age of 82 in 1940, shortly before the Germans rounded up all of those Italians "tainted" with Jewish blood. The Jew-hating Edgardo ironically would have died as a Jew at the hands of the Nazis, subjected to the same atrocities as the descendants of his siblings.


