"Y" POOL CLOSED

At the suggestion of the Board of Health all public and private swimming pools are closed until further notice. This action is taken in the best interest of public health and safety.

Although the "Y" has always maintained one of the highest sanitation ratings for swimming pools in the city we feel that it is incumbent upon us to comply with this health regulation. The pool will, therefore, remain closed until further notice. Date of opening will be announced in the daily papers. Shower facilities, however, will still be available and in operation.

HOME CAMP TO END AUGUST 18th

The 10th season of the "Y" Home Camp will officially close on this Friday, August 18th. Closing day exercises will be held and a special program presented by the children. Parents will be invited to be the guests of the youngsters and to participate in the program. The entire project has been under the able supervision of Miss Sarah F. Goldstein. More than 45 children were registered and an average attendance of 36 was maintained throughout the season.

In order that the progress made and the observations recorded during the seven weeks of the camp may be of benefit and value to the parents, a special report has been compiled for each child indicating personality development, associations in group life, initiative, adaptability, health, etc. ParThe Jewish community of Wilmington has suffered a shocking loss during the month of July. In those thirty-one days, six of the most personable young men of the city paid the supreme sacrifice in the service of their country.

We take this opportunity of paying tribute to their memory so that the cause for which they died may be emblazoned upon the hearts and minds of every citizen. These young men were typical of the hundreds of thousands of American Jews who are today placed in the peril of their lives, so that we at home, may continue to live and prosper for those principles of Americanism and Judaism which have made for progress and liberty.

We, each of us, owe a debt which it will be impossible to repay. To their parents we express our deepest emotions of sympathy and condolence.
