Your ~~is~~ conciliatory letter rec'd but I ~~am~~ must say I doubt if there will be any "reconsideration". I've always believed that once a person makes such a decision as I have made, there is no going back, for the basic reason that quite often such a decision ~~was~~ ^{is} made after considerable soul searching and reflection.

Frankly, I'm terribly disillusioned by your attitude and approach to The Jewish Voice which many of us had hoped to have developed into a real newspaper for the Jewish community of Delaware and not merely a house organ for the fund raising efforts of the Federation, or for a ballyhoo organ for the people ~~we~~ who contribute a lot of ~~money~~ ^{so often} money for the Federation. So many pictures, for example, of the few who serve!!!

One ~~diff~~ difficulty with you-- if I ~~am~~ ^{may} write frankly, and with predecessor your ~~predecessor~~ has been your indifference to the efforts of Simon Steinberg who has worked hard, long and diligently as chairman of the Voice committee.-- and the ~~diff~~ indifference to the committee. There were ~~possibilities~~ ^{possibilities} of effecting a balance but this, apparently, was not your way of working.

I am happy that I am not beholden either to you or any member of the board of the Federation but I might give you some advice: When you are older, perhaps you can think ~~back~~ back to this incident and realize there are better ways of handling a dedicated volunteer.
