I'm stationed in the deep south, and when I say deep south I really mean it. It's something you would have to see for yourself to believe.

The big town is about 6 miles from camp. What a burg! It's starting to become civilized now, about 50% of the people are ~~wearing~~ wearing shoes. There's also a rumor that they intend to introduce electricity. They have a grand total of two Jewish families. So you see Mollye, we don't have much of a social life here. ~~We spend most of our time sleeping, or taking sun baths.~~

As far as the camp goes it's swell, you couldn't find a nicer bunch of officers anywhere. They realize what we're up against and try to make things easier for us, by bringing in a lot of swell shows.

~~Mollye right now I'm in the ground crew "keeping them flying". It's really interesting work, and I enjoy it very much. I expect to be sent to a Air mechanics school very shortly.~~

It's just starting to rain, and that means no flying today. So I'll end this letter

and go back to bed.
