

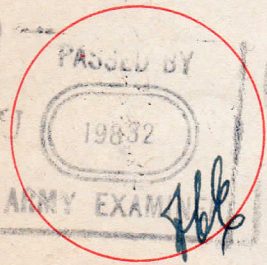

I surprise myself. I'm getting to be quite a correspondent. Actually it is the result of the work I am doing at present which affords me plenty of time for scribbling out notes.

The main job has been accomplished in this campaign and, at present, we are having a breathing spell. Conditions in the field have improved considerably for the men. Last we realize that we have not been forgotten in the war. Supplies of all sorts are reaching us. Eggs in shells are no longer a curiosity. Turkey and fresh meat are also reaching us. Now, if they could send our families over, everything would be all right. Better still, I'd rather go home, what with its rationing problems, inflation etc.

I'd appreciate the addresses of any of the men who might be in this theatre. However, Ed.
