

MINUTES

MEETING OF THE PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE
OF THE JEWISH COMMUNITY CEMETERY ASSN.

Sunday, May 3, 1953 10 A. M.
100 E. 7 Street

A meeting of the Planning and Development Committee of the Jewish Community Cemetery Association was held Sunday morning, 10 o'clock, in the Federation office. Mr. Samuel Keil, chairman, presided and the following members were present: Jacob Balick representing Moses Montefiore in place of Nathan P. Michlin, Herbert L. Cobin, Charles Schnitzer, Henry Schultz, Abe Shulman, and A. Roke Lieberman.

A letter was received from Van Demark and Lynch regarding the topographical survey which was made some time ago and advising the Association that expenditures up to the present time amounted to \$441.75. The letter also suggested various plans for the development of the Cemetery. The Chairman felt that the complete survey will cost approximately \$2500. Therefore, the question for this committee to consider is whether each participant is willing and able to share in the total cost of the survey.

Jacob Balick speaking for the Moses Montefiore and Henry Schultz speaking for the Workmen's Circle felt that they merely wanted their land and were not interested in any future development. A long discussion ensued and a recommendation was made, seconded and approved that the three congregations, namely, Adas Kodesch, Chesed Shel Emeth and Beth Shalom purchase from the Workmen's Circle their interest in the Cemetery. It was felt that this may be a means of solving the problem without Moses Montefiore and without the Workmen's Circle. There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned with the recommendation that another meeting be held on Sunday, May 10th at which time representatives from each organization should be prepared to approve the expenditure of the \$2,500.
