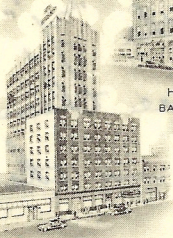
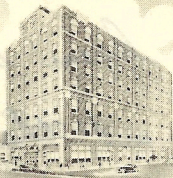

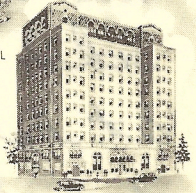

Sunday Feb. 13, 1944
