Polly Zavadivker (pronounced Za-va-diff-ker!) is Assistant Professor in the Department of History and since 2017 has been the faculty director of the Program in Jewish Studies at the University of Delaware. She received her PhD in History from the University of California and master's degrees in Judaic Studies and Non-profit Management from NYU. A scholar of 20th century East European Jewish history, she is completing a book entitled "A Nation of Refugees: World War I and Russia's Jews" to be published with Oxford University Press in 2024. Her previous book was a translation from Russian of *The 1915 Diary of S. An-sky: A Russian Jewish Writer at the Eastern Front* (Bloomington: Indiana University Press, 2016).
